DES's NMITD in association with Fitstart organized a webinar on immunity passport titled “Immunity Passport --- In wake of Covid 19 – The need of the Hour”

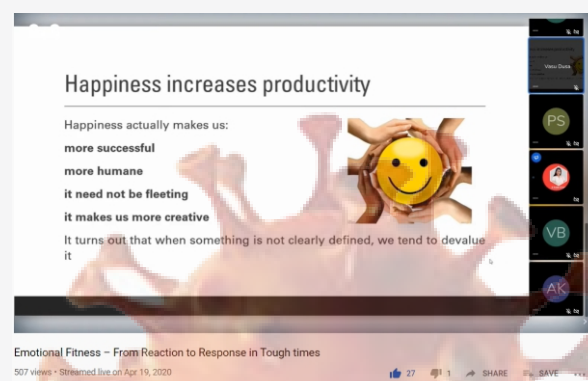
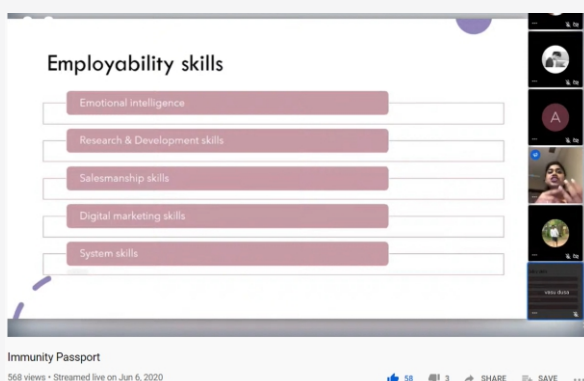

MCA department of Deccan Education Society's Navinchandra Mehta Institute of Technology and Development [NMITD] organized a guest lecture on Problem-Solving and Other Skillsets required for various job roles in Information Technology on Friday 23rd August 2019 between 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM in class E15 for the MCA SEM V and MMS-IT students. Around 45 students from MCA SEM-V and 7 students from MMS-IT attended the session.

The speaker was Mr. Dhananjay Prajapati, Director of Web Technologies at Zeus learning Pvt Ltd, having 15+ years of experience in diverse roles as Technology Manager, Product Development in E-Learning domain, and Training and Mentoring of software developers. The guest speaker was greeted with a warm welcome by Prof Mr. Pratik A. Desai who also introduced the guest speaker to students.

The session was held with the intent of enlightening the students about the skill-sets required to do well in ever changing IT field. He spoke about how the fundamental subject knowledge and strong conceptual foundations in core subjects such as Programming, Networking, Database Systems, Computer Graphics etc helps students to improve their critical thinking abilities. Even though the technology stack keeps on changing the mastery of these fundamental subjects continues to help in learning new things.

He then explored the current IT-Job landscape to introduce students to various jobs available today in IT for beginners. He described and discussed the skill-sets required for the following IT-Job Roles for beginners/freshers: 1) Frontend Programmer, 2) Backend Programmer, 3) Database Developer, 4) Full Stack Developer, 5) DevOps, 6) UX/UI, 7) Manual Tester, 8) Automation Tester, and 9) Load Tester. He elucidated and clarified the specific particular technologies to be mastered and skills required for each of these roles.

When it comes to general skill-sets he categorized them into seven levels: 1) Problem Solving Skills, 2) Logical Skills, 3) Quick Reference and Implementation Skills, 4) Estimation Skills, 5) Communication Skills, 6) Design Skills and 7) S/W Testing Skills. He urged students to develop these skills by implementing projects and even related each of these skills to core subjects in MCA curriculum. For instance good fundamental knowledge of Software Engineering subject helps in improving Estimation Skills. Understanding of Organization Behavior (previously a part of MCA curriculum) helps improve Communication Skills, and knowledge of Object Oriented Programming and User Interfaces /Computer Graphics helps in honing design skills. He throughout emphasized the importance of sticking to the basics and implementing one's own small projects to concretize the learning of various skills.

The session was highly informative and interactive where the students interacted enthusiastically and Mr. Dhananjay Prajapati answered all the queries and clarified their doubts with patience. The students left the classroom with a sense of motivation, knowing what the importance of fundamentals in fulfilling their career objectives in the ever-changing technology landscape in the Information Technology world.

Workshop on Anti-Corruption Laws on 31st October 2019

(Organized by Library Dept on Occasion of A.P.J Abdul Kalam Birth Anniversary)

As part of Vigilance Awareness Week 2019 that was observed this year from 28th October to 2nd November, we at Navinchandra Mehta Institute of Technology and Development (NMITD), in association with Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB, Maharashtra) organized a one-day workshop to create awareness among students and faculty members regarding the existing Anti-Corruption Laws and their scope and applicability as related to public servants and govt officers involved in various sectors of state and central level departments.

Mr. L. M. Karde, Senior Advocate with more than 55 years' experience in dealing with legal issues related to corruption matters and Mr M. N. Muguttrao, Assistant Commissioner of Police, ACB Mumbai Range were the expert resource persons for the session.

Advocate Karde shed light on the evolution of Anti-Corruption Laws in India right from the pre-independence era 'Prevention of Corruption Act 1947' (which came in force on 11 March 1947), to the Prevention of Corruption Act 1988 (it made some punishments more stringent) upto the most recent 'Prevention of Corruption Amendment Act 2018 (which came in force on 26th July 2018). The session was conducted in a lively and interactive manner. From his vast experience Advocate Karde shared interesting real anti-corruption cases, to highlight the pitfalls involved in proving the case, the existing conviction rates, the various loop-holes that are exploited for aquital and other matters. He emphasized the role of three critical factors in such cases: 1) the involvement of investigating officer 2) the nature of judge (he characterized judges into three broad categories as: punishing judges, acquitting judges appreciating judges) and 3) the public prosecutor running the case.

Mr. M. N. Muguttrao, Asst Commr of Police ACB, shared with the audiences the nature of working of ACB Maharashtra in handling the corruption cases right from when they receive such complaints to the point of conviction. He explained the protocol followed to verify and validate the claims before filing the case to avoid unnecessary harrasment due to possibility of false cases filed with the intention to malign someone. The various contact channels and social media details for contacting ACB for filing corruption complaints were shared with the participants.

Introduction and Vote-of-Thanks was delivered by Ms Renuka Sawant, Asst. Prof, MMS Department. Together around 60 participants including MCA/MMS students and faculty members attended the workshop. **ACB Anti Corruption Laws Workshop.**

There are another people of the population i.e. **22%** on this planet who know their goals but don't write their goals on a piece of paper. There are another people of the population i.e. **3%** who formulate goals for themselves and write them in their diaries. Amongst these 3 categories of people – the first 75 % people are total failures because they don't know which direction to go in life. The next 75 % work hard in their life but lack dedication and the rare but passionate are those 3% who write their goals. Hence, it is very important for everyone to formulate their goals in life and write them down. For these 3 % talented people there will be no competition because they themselves are '**The Competition**' in the market.

Enthusiastic and optimistic Mr. Vivek Ranaware also revealed the immense power of our '**Subconscious Mind**'. Anything which you will tell your subconscious mind will start becoming true very soon. Start telling yourself what you expect to become rather than pitying yourself for the skills you lack. In a few days, you will see the change. Try the 21 days challenge and you will become what you wish to be. For instance, say “**I am Knowledgeable**”, “I am open and receptive to all the wealth life offers me”, “Today and everyday my thirst for learning is alive and well in me”.

The few more important things which Mr. Vivek Ranaware told students that '**Never Try**' for anything in your life. There are two options either you do it or you don't. So never try. You should '**Dream Big**'. Why do you want to spend your life earning a 4- or 5-digit salary? Aim for a 9-digit salary. Do smart work, acquire the required skills and you will succeed. Don't waste your time on social media. Social media is becoming an addiction for today 's youth. Have a LinkedIn profile rather than having an Instagram or Facebook profile.

We can conclude by saying that all the students felt very lucky to have got an opportunity to attend such a wonderful seminar conducted by Mr. Vivek Ranaware who is an Expert in corporate trainings. The seminar was an eye-opener for all students. All students were felt very energized and motivated after the seminar and have already started to '**Dream Big**'.

He covered almost all the facets of IPR such as geographical indicator, patent, copyrights, trademarks, industrial designs, traditional knowledge and their rules and their importance globally.
2. **Why to File Patent?:** This second session was delivered by Dr. Bhushan Chaudhari. He described about tangible and intangible properties. He emphasized that “the driving force behind the economic development is the nations' innovative input and innovative output of which the ratio is known as innovation index.” He concluded his session by saying that “patents can generate wealth and bring power to the individual, organization and at large the nation and hence, one needs to think of patents to file.”
3. **Patent Filing and Procedure in India:** Ms Sandhya Kothari was the speaker for this session. She explained in details the pprocedures to file patent, the requirement of patent filing, and the forms to be filled during submission.

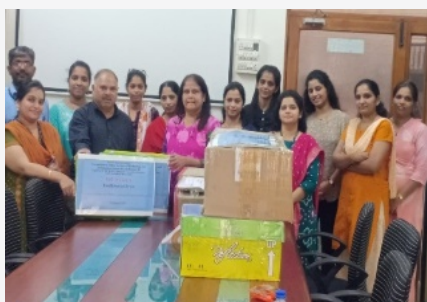
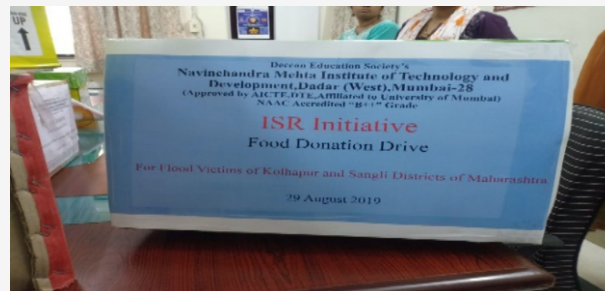
