

"Student Council Report for the year 2018-19"

At NMITD, student council is the main body representing students in all student related matters in the Institute. It also acts as a platform for the active participation and representation of the students in the various academic & administrative bodies.



The elected student representatives, on behalf of their fellow students, articulate their views and ideas in all student related matters in the institute. By means of this council student community gets an opportunity to get directly involved and have their say in making organizational and operational decisions pertaining to many academic and extracurricular activities within the context of the institute. Composition: To respect the principle of proportional representation the student council is composed of 9 elected representatives, which includes:

The Deccan Education Society (DES), is a star in the galaxy of educational institutes, having a 132 glorious years legacy imparting value based education for masses was since 1884. He ended his speech, by exhorting all the gathered teachers to emphasize on all these different dimensions of education so that the resulting students does not only have knowledge and intelligence but also skills and wisdom and most importantly the will power to manage the learning process and emphasize on all these different dimensions of education so that the resulting students does not only have knowledge and intelligence but also skills and wisdom and most importantly the will power to make good use of these in even difficult circumstances.

Last but not the least, on this occasion of founder's day, the teaching & non-teaching community of DES Mumbai Campus was addressed by Advocate Mr Neel Helekar Sir, CDC Chairman Kirti College, as well as Member, Senate and Management Council, Univ of Mumbai. Roobaroo 2019: An Annual Inter


College Festival of NMITD
