




Health, Hygiene and Security: PCOD/PCOS Awareness Camp was organized by WDC,

Prof. R. D Kulkarni Sir, elaborated on "Rsayana Shastra in Ancient India" referred to the subject of Chemistry based on the chemical activities involved in biological and inorganic processes. It was also called Rasatantra, Rasa Kriya or Rasa Vidya roughly translating to 'Science of Liquids'. "Rasa" in ayurvedic terminology refers to mercury and Rasashastra exclusively deals with the treatment using mercury and its compounds. It is well known that science and technology in ancient and medieval India covered all the major branches of human knowledge and activities, including mathematics, astronomy, physics, chemistry, medical science and surgery etc.

He further, elaborated that, the earliest evidence of chemical knowledge possessed by the ancient Indians in the prehistoric age has been brought to light by the findings of archaeological excavations in Baluchistan, Sindh and Punjab. The ruins of the Indus Valley Civilization that have been unearthed at in these areas furnish much information about the chemical knowledge acquired by the Indus Valley people, particularly with reference to the practical arts like pottery, brick-making, and extraction and working of metals.

Prof P Kanagasabapathy, Professor and Former Director, Tamil Nadu Institute of Urban Studies, Coimbatore, spoke on 'Ancient Indian Models of Business, Trade and Economics". He gives masterly analysis of not only the Indian economic, business and management models, but also the popular economic, business and management models of the other countries. Prof. Kanagasabapathy, asserted that a paradigm shift in thinking is urgently needed to understand the ground realities and the functioning Indian systems, so that the country could be taken forward with the necessary orientation and suitable policies.

Prof Bishnu Mohan Dash, Professor, B R AMBEDKAR COLLEGE, Delhi University

Spoke on "Bharatiyakaran of Social Work". Dr. Dash believed that, Euro-centric scholars in social work in India still maintain the status quo and have completely sidelined the Indic wisdom and Indian knowledge systems in the field of social work. Despite numerous attempts by UGC to

indigenize the curriculum, it still remained Euro-American centric. Bharatiyakaran of Social Work is absolutely an integrated, inclusive and holistic curriculum has to be adopted among the social work institutions of India, which will definitely enhance their skills and potentials and help them effectively to contribute to achieve Vikshit Bharat and to establish an aspiring India, one that advances and reasserts herself as a Vishwaguru, a leader of humanity.

Prof S Agarkar, Professor and Dean, VPM'S Academy of International Education and Research, spoke on "Vedic Math in Modern Era". he ancient Indian system of calculation skills known as Vedic Math was created in 1957 using 16-word equations and a few sub-formulae. In competitive exams, it might be challenging for students to efficiently complete the aptitude questions in the allotted time. Students understand the problem but are unable to speed up the computation process, which is required to solve any arithmetic, algebraic, geometry, or trigonometry problem. A scholar of Sanskrit, mathematics, and philosophy named Jagadguru Sri Bharathi Krishna Thirthaji Maharaja first uncovered Vedic mathematics from Indian scriptures between 1911 and 1918, and he completed its development in 1957. All the arithmetic operations will reduce the burden of competitive examinations reasoning problems and also students can be able to solve more problems within a short duration of time. It improves concentration and logical thinking. Problemsolving and the handling of data, numbers, and information are two aspects of mathematics. Math requires three primary brain processes executive control, data organisation, and information storage. in brain's different region different functions are executed during maths. The computation and processing of numbers are primarily handled by the parietal lobe regions, whereas working memory and recall of prior numerical knowledge are handled by the frontal lobe regions of brain. Prof. N Jaysankaran Natesa Ayyar, Former Vice Chancellor, Kanchi University and Director General, BIM Tiruchirapalli delivered an enlightening address, highlighting the relevance of ancient wisdom in navigating contemporary challenges. Drawing from ancient Indian wisdom, BODHI,' focusing on Indian Ethos in Management. The initiative aims to bridge the gap between traditional values and contemporary business strategies, drawing inspiration from sacred texts such as the 'Gita,' 'Upanishads,'. He also elaborated on the concept of 'Antar Mouna' or Inner Silence—a practice rooted in mindfulness and introspection. He stressed that self-examination enables individuals to


identify their strengths, weaknesses, and biases, thus empowering them to make informed decisions and lead with integrity.

7. Prof. Manoj Tiwari, Director, IIM, Vice Chancellor, TISS, Indian Knowledge system and Technology Applications in his lucid style, enthralled the faculty members on Indian Knowledge system and Technology Applications- especially with respect to the logistics in Ancient India". India's strategic geographic location has made it a crucial trading hub since ancient times. The country's trade relations with civilizations like Mesopotamia, Egypt, and China can be traced back to the Indus Valley Civilization around 2500 BCE. The civilization's well-planned cities and advanced infrastructure showcased early logistics practices, including efficient road networks, warehouses, and river transportation.

During the Mauryan Empire (322 BCE — 185 BCE), Emperor Ashoka established an extensive network of roads, known as the "Grand Trunk Road," connecting various parts of the empire. This road network played a vital role in facilitating trade and commerce, as well as in military logistics. He also elaborated about the medieval era witnessed the emergence of the Silk Road, connecting India with Central Asia, the Middle East, and Europe. Indian merchants played a crucial role in the silk and spice trade along this historic route, which spanned thousands of miles and facilitated the exchange of goods, ideas, and cultures.

Maritime trade also flourished during this period, with Indian merchants using the monsoon winds to navigate the Arabian Sea and the Indian Ocean. The port cities of Gujarat, such as Surat and Cambay, emerged as major trading centers, attracting merchants from around the world. Logistics practices like warehousing, customs clearance, and cargo handling became essential components of these vibrant trading hubs.


Details of the activity:

















MCA Research Paper Writing Workshop







शिरवाडकर हे प्रसिद्ध मराठी नाटककार, कादंबरीकार, लघुकथा लेखक, कवी आणि मानवतावादी होते. त्यांनी न्याय, स्वातंत्र्य आणि गरिबीसारख्या सामाजिक आजारांबद्दल विपुल लेखन केले.

1999 मध्ये कुसुमाग्रजांच्या निधनानंतर सरकारने "मराठी राजभाषा गौरव दिन" साजरा करण्यास सुरुवात केली मराठी साहित्यातील प्रतिभेची ओळख करून त्यांचे कौतुक करणे हा या दिनाचा उद्देश आहे. सर्व समकालीन इंडो-आर्यन भाषांपैकी, मराठी भाषेत काही प्राचीन साहित्य आहे, जे सुमारे 900 AD पर्यंतचे आहे.


A creative and graceful dance performance of the MCA student named Shruti Pathak added elegance to the event's opening.














Ramgeete Musical Event


- Registration: A registration desk was set up to enroll participants and provide them with necessary information regarding the donation process.

Conclusion: The blood donation camp at DES's NMITD was a resounding success, showcasing the institute's commitment to social responsibility and community welfare. The event not only



Observational Survey of few Railway Stations for suggesting interventions for Safety of Local commuters under the guidance of Hon'ble CP Dr. Ravindra Shisve

Project Overview:

Under the esteemed guidance of Hon'ble Commissioner of Police, Dr. Ravindra Shisve, a significant observational survey was conducted at select railway stations in Mumbai to recommend safety interventions for local commuters. The project was carried out by a group of students from the Master of Computer Applications (MCA) and Master of Management Studies (MMS) programs, alongside diploma students from Kirti M. Doongursee College of Arts, Science, and Commerce (Autonomous). This initiative stemmed from a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed on March 27th, 2024, between the DES Mumbai Campus and Mumbai Railway Police, which was signed by Hon'ble Commissioner, Mumbai Railway Police, Dr. Ravindra Shisve and the Principal, Kirti M Doongursee College of Arts, Science and Commerce (Autonomous), Dr. D V Pawar and I/C Director, Dr. Anita P Bobade.

Survey Details

Dates of Field Visit: 20th and 27th April, 2024

Stations Surveyed: Ghatkopar, Kurla, Thane, and Kalyan Railway Stations

Mentors: Dr. Anita Boabde and Dr. Sulakshana Vispute, ISR Committee DES Campus

Objectives of the Survey

- 1. Investigate the Causes of Injuries and Deaths:
 - -Police Station Visits and CCTV Analysis: To identify the reasons behind accidents, including trespassing, vandalism, theft, and damage to railway infrastructure.
 - -Observational Study: Conducted at the railway stations to recognize contributing factors to accidents.
 - Focused Group Interviews: Engaged with Sub-Inspectors of the GRP to gather insights into safety concerns and ongoing measures.

2. Data Compilation and Analysis:

- Students recorded their observations during the visits and analyzed the data with guidance from the project mentors.

3. Suggestions for Safety Interventions:

- After thorough analysis, the students proposed several interventions to enhance the safety of railway commuters, which were highly commended by the Mumbai Railway Police.

Student Learnings and Experiences:

-Exposure to Governmental Operations:

The students gained firsthand experience in understanding the operational dynamics of governmental bodies, particularly in law enforcement and public safety.

The project provided an invaluable opportunity for students to engage with real-world issues, fostering a deep sense of social responsibility and contributing to the community's welfare.

This exposure to governmental functioning and the challenges of public safety will significantly benefit the students in their future careers, equipping them with practical knowledge and experience in handling complex social issues.

Confidentiality

The findings from the survey are of a confidential nature and cannot be disclosed. However, the experience and the process have been incredibly impactful for the students involved.






